From the Pastor

Birthdays and anniversaries are important events in the life of a family and in our case First Cumberland Presbyterian Church. That's right. First Church will celebrate it's 75th birthday this month. Here is a part of our history.

"First Cumberland Presbyterian Church was organized on May 30, 1942, in Louisville, Kentucky. It had 25 charter members. The first services were held in an Evangelical Church until an upstairs hall was rented at 28th and Grand. In 1943, a basement building was purchased, and a new building was begun in 1949, with a total of 163 members. In 1954, several members were dismissed to begin the Hillview Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

In 1958, the property was sold to the Ebenezer Baptist Church and a new site was purchased, at 4610 Manslick Road. First services were held in the new fellowship hall in July, 1960. Plans for a new sanctuary were soon developed and construction began in 1969. The new building was dedicated in February, 1970." Rev. Ray Morris was the founding pastor.

We want to extend a special invitation to all our current and past members and friends to attend on Sunday, May 21 at 10:30 AM. It will be a service filled with music, scripture, and testimony of God's work over the past 75 years. If you cannot attend, please send a note, letter, or copy of some pictures connected with First church and its ministry. We will share these either in the service or during the meal time following.

SESSION NOTES

REGULARLY STATED SESSION MEETING – April 30, 2017

The stated meeting of the Session was called to order on April 30, 2017 by Moderator, Rev. Rodney Harris, with a quorum declared at noon.

Elders present: Rodger Davis, Ralph Hawkins, Laura Kaelin, Steve Skipper, and Steve Young.

Janet Turner is at Franciscan Healthcare with another week or two of rehab. Motion to excuse her was approved.

Laura Kaelin gave the opening prayer.

The minutes of the Stated Meeting of March 19 were read by clerk Laura Kaelin and placed in the Session records book. These minutes was approved by vote.

COMMUNICATIONS / CORRESPONDANCE:

Brother Rodney shared that the Pike legal team for T-Mobile has recommended that the cell tower

proposed to be built on our property NOT be brought before the Jefferson County Zoning Board on April 6. Pike stated the reason being that there was too much opposition from the neighborhood association. NOTE: There has been very little opposition from the Neighborhood Association. In the two meetings they had (among 1500 homes), about 25 people showed up at the first one and even less at the second one. There were not many signing the petition. However, we believe that politics has played the main role in stopping this installation. A letter will be sent to T-Mobile stating our disappointment and sharing reasons we believe the zoning board would have approved the tower.

The property at 4600 Manslick Road (northern neighbor) has been purchased from the bank foreclosure and the young couple plan to fix it up and resell it. They have removed the fence bordering our property and moved it off our property and back onto theirs. They removed two old large dying trees in their front yard, making the property look much nicer.

Have met with an area church group interested in renting our church facilities on Sunday afternoons and Thursday nights.

Our church activities and theirs would not be affected by the other. We will know more in a few weeks.

Building & Grounds Committee

Rodger Davis gave us an overview of the current needs including volunteers to help cut the church lawn.

Special thanks to Ralph Hawkins for spraying the weeds around the church and in the parking lot. Discussed the vehicle parking when the church is not in session. Motion was approved to put a chain and lock on the west side parking lot gate, and to send a letter to affected parties that this is to be done for security, maintenance, and to stop the misuse.

Committee on Worship, Missions, & Christian Fellowship

A review of the church ministry calendar was noted.

Delbert Kyle has been leading our music for some of our morning worship services. Caleb O'Meara has also been assisting Delbert in these services as well. Delbert and Caleb have consented to lead our music service as often as he is in

town. They have been doing a very good job. When Delbert is out of town, we will use music videos in our worship services.

Special thanks to Ralph and Carol Hawkins for overseeing the preparation for celebrating the Lord's Supper on Easter Sunday morning.

The Fellowship Time on Sunday mornings at 10:10 AM is being enjoyed by all in attendance.

Cumberland Presbytery's Junior (June 12- 16 at Camp Nikao) and Senior High (June 19-24 at Camp Crescendo) camps are drawing close. Steve Skipper was asked to attend Junior Camp if possible this year. We may have some Junior campers this year. Megan Kaelin and Elizabeth Heiskell are planning to attend as staffers.

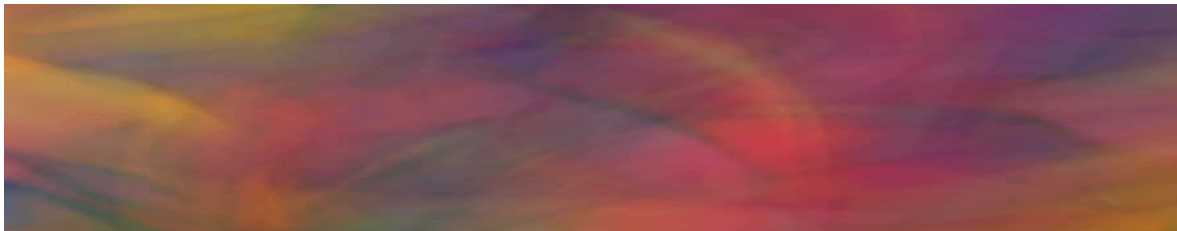
