SESSION NOTES

CALLED SESSION MEETING – December 30, 2017

The called meeting of the Session was called to order on December30, 2017 by session clerk, Laura Kaelin, with a quorum declared at noon.

Elders present: Rodger Davis, Ralph Hawkins, Sean O'Meara, Steve Young, Steve Skipper, Janet Turner and Laura Kaelin.

Steve Skipper opened the meeting with prayer.

Background.

The Session met with Ronda Chaddic and Danny Allen on December 13 to hear a request to allow them to keep their four dogs and cat in the manse (See November 24 minutes ... Recent Session actions included asking the Chaddics to remove the dogs by January 1).

The Session further discussed possible actions in response to this discussion.

The motion was made and approved that the church purchase signs to be posted on the gates and fence at the manse property warning to beware of the dogs on the property.

The motion was made and approved that on the anniversary of their lease, that we require the leasee to increase their medical and liability insurance to the amount recommended by our insurance company as appropriate.

The motion was made and approved to require the leasee to provide at least two phone numbers where they can be contacted should anyone need to access the property.

The motion was made and approved to adjourn the meeting with Laura Kaelin offering the closing prayer.

Building & Grounds Committee

Noted that the garbage disposal has been replaced in the kitchen.

CUMBERLAND COUR9ER

Noted that we have had to have the driveways and parking lot salted and graded one week in December by Nathan Hartlage.

<u>Committee on Worship, Missions,</u> <u>& Christian Fellowship</u>

On February 4, we will celebrate Denomination Sunday with a program on the history of the church with an old fashioned bean dinner to follow including Bean Soup, Corn Bread, Salad and Desserts. Becki Baker will coordinate the meal.

Communion will also be served during the morning worship service.

Finance Committee

A set of financial statements for November and December along with current banking statements were shared by Ralph Hawkins, reviewed, and approved by vote.

A letter of record for 2017 giving is being prepared by Stacy to mail out to all who made donations to the church last year.

Christian Education Committee

Steve Skipper reported on the success of the Christmas Party

being attended well. Noted that the Presbytery Youth retreat was cancelled in January due to the snow and ice.

Our Midweek ministry is lagging in attendance. Most of the youth attending are unable to attend at times since they are dependant upon someone for their transportation.

Steve continues efforts to connect with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes program at Farnsley Middle School. He has led at some of those meetings.

We had two carloads of carolers in our December outing in December. We were able to visit some of our shut-ins and older members.

OLD BUSINESS

Ralph, Rodger, and Bro. Rodney presented information they have gathered concerning the possibility of replacing the <u>carpet</u> and pew covers in the sanctuary and foyer. They presented samples from two companies with estimates to consider. Noted the current carpet was installed in 1987. Another carpet business will be contacted for a third estimate.

Motion made, seconded, and approved to replace the carpet and pew coverings in the sanctuary and foyer areas. Motion made, seconded, and approved to obtain pledges with the goal of raising \$20,000 to replace the carpet and pew coverings in the sanctuary and foyer areas by March 4.

Did our annual review of <u>manse</u> <u>lease agreement</u>. The anniversary date of this lease is March 3.

We purchased some "Beware of Dogs" signs to be placed on the gates and fence area at the manse. Metro pet regulations require pet owners to have a license and certain vaccinations.

We want to make sure all pets have current licenses and vaccinations for each of the five pets for insurance liability.

Motion approved to increase manse rent from \$700 to \$800 per month. The Chaddics have not had a rent increase since they moved in two years ago. (Current monthly rental rates for a house this size in our area is about \$1,000.)

NEW BUSINESS

A local truck driver has approached the church and is requesting permission to park his trailor on our parking lot on the weekends. He pulls the trailor with a medium sized truck, not a semi.

Motion approved to allow him to park his trailor in the northwest corner of our lot for \$100 a month. We will draw up a liability agreement for both parties to sign. Christian O'Meara suggests we put our morning service on a live feed through our Facebook page. He will use his phone to do this. Motion approved for Christian to experiment with broadcasting our services live. Elders are encouraged to be in contact with our individual sheep on a regular basis.

The next Stated Meeting is scheduled for February 18, 2018 after church.

Motion made and approved to adjourn the meeting with Janet Turner offering the closing prayer.

Robert "Bob" Spivey, 86, passed away peacefully on Sunday, January 21, 2018. He was born on March 28, 1931 and was a lifelong resident of Louisville. He grew up in the Portland neighborhood and graduated from Ahrens Trade School in 1949. After serving in both the United States Naval Reserve and the United States Army, he graduated from the University of Louisville with a degree in Physics. Bob retired from Brown and Williamson Tobacco Corporation in 1991 after 38 years of service. He had an Amateur Radio License, Private Pilot's License and was a member of the Civil Air Patrol. He was an avid runner; running 30 consecutive mini-marathons, and was a member of First Cumberland Presbyterian Church. His father, Cash Spivey, mother, Molly Ray and brother, Cash Spivey, Jr. have preceded him in death. A much loved husband, father and grandfather "Poppy", he is survived by his wife of 55 years, to the former, Anna Jean Carlton. The estimate for the carpet and pew coverings amount to \$20,000. The current carpeting was put down in 1987 (31 years ago), while the pew coverings are original with the sanctuary's dedication in 1970 (48 years ago).

Over the years, the roof leaks have left many stains in the carpet and on pew coverings. The many years of wear and tear have also taken their toll on our furnishings. We would like to update our sanctuary and restore its beauty.
