# SESSION NOTES

## REGULARLY STATED SESSION MEETING – June 24, 2018

The stated meeting of the Session was called to order on June 24, 2018 by Moderator, Rev. Rodney Harris, with a quorum declared at noon.

Elders present: Rodger Davis, Ralph Hawkins, Laura Kaelin, and Steve Young. Bro. Rodney Harris opened our meeting with prayer. Sean O’Meara (work today), Janet Turner (Health), and Steve Skipper (Honeymoon) were excused by vote.

The minutes of the Stated Meeting of May 20, 2018 had been read on the Session’s Facebook page earlier. These minutes were verbally reviewed by clerk Laura Kaelin to the Session, approved by vote, and placed in the Session records book.

### COMMUNICATIONS / CORRESPONDANCE:

Received letters from:

(1) Trinity Cumberland Presbyterian Church in America with an invitation to their Missionary Tea being held today.

(2) Shively Area Ministries noting their 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, \$300,000 campaign. Currently, \$158,950 has been raised.

### COMMITTEES

#### Building & Grounds Committee

Rodger brought to our attention work completed recently: (1) Sidewalk on the north and south sides were power washed; (2) “NO PARKING” signs were purchased and put up in the parking lot to help curb non church and late hours related parking; (3) church gas blower was repaired; (4) A carpenter bee trap was made and installed near the south door.

Received a letter from Louisville Metro Zoning Board concerning uncut weeds in the ditch next to Manslick Road. Noted that this ditch is taken care of by the state and has already been cut by the state.

There are still some projects on our “work List” from the fall work day that were not completed but still need to be done. Please look them over and ask Rodger Davis about them.

The western garage door opener is not functioning properly and still needs to be repaired.

A piece of siding near the top edge of the sanctuary on the west end has come loose and needs to be secured.

Some fill dirt will be delivered soon that will be used fill large ruts and holes, cover the garage drain pipes, and fill in places eroded around a waste water drain basin.

#### Committee on Worship, Missions, & Christian Fellowship

Reviewed church ministry calendar:

Noted the July 4<sup>th</sup> Fun Fest here at the church starting at 2 PM. Plans include music by Delbert Kyle and Johnny B, good food, a giant water slide, games, and volleyball. Anyone willing to provide homemade ice cream is asked to contact Carol Hawkins who is coordinating the afternoon food. Please come and invite someone to attend. This is a free event.

The Lord’s Supper will be served on July 1st.

Ro. Rodney recently purchased a wrap around

mic wire to replace a broken one for his mic.

We want to continue to encourage food donations to Shively Are Ministries.

**Finance Committee**

A set of financial statements for May along with current banking statements were shared by Ralph Hawkins, reviewed, and approved by vote.

We will ask Megan Kaelin to set up a table to encourage more people to sign up for the Kroger Card fund raiser for non profit organizations such as our church. This program continues to help our church financially. This will not affect the cost of anything they buy and is easy to fill out.

Noted the carpet estimates and pledges to date. We are about still about one third from our goal (\$15,000 Carpet & \$5,000 pew coverings).

**Christian Education Committee**

We had five youth who attended Cumberland Presbytery's Senior Camp June 18-23. The church paid one half (\$62.50) of each camper's fee.

We hope to set a date for VBS soon for a July or August VBS.

Some local churches have been approached about forming a co-ed church volleyball league. Others will be contacted in hopes of acquiring enough teams for a league.

**OTHER BUSINESS**

Presented an idea for a temporary fix to cover the large carpet stains in the sanctuary altar area. A carpet dye chemist recently visited the church and looked over the carpet and stains. He spoke of the technique used and that this procedure was very common and that he has done it many times for satisfied homeowners.

Approved securing The Carpet Chemist business to dye the stained areas of carpet in the altar area to their original color. The cost will be \$300.

Delbert will continue to lead our music program along with Laura Kaelin playing the clavinova, and Steve Skipper playing his bass guitar at times for the immediate future. We appreciate Delbert and Laura sharing their talents with the church.

Reviewed our Elder Shepherding Ministry. Elders are encouraged to be in contact with our individual sheep on a regular basis.

The next Stated Meeting is scheduled for July 8, 2018 after church.

Motion made and approved to adjourn the meeting with Steve Young offering the closing prayer.
