SESSION NOTES

REGULARLY STATED SESSION MEETING – August 12, 2018

The stated meeting of the Session was called to order on August 12, 2018 by Moderator, Rev. Rodney Harris, with a quorum declared at 12:10 PM.

Elders present: Rodger Davis, Ralph Hawkins, Laura Kaelin, Steve Skipper, and Steve Young.

Steve Young opened our meeting with prayer.

Sean O’Meara (work) and Janet Turner (Health) were excused by vote.

The minutes of the Stated Meeting of July 8, 2018 had been read on the Session’s Facebook page earlier. Motion was made to dispense with the reading of the July minutes, and approve as read. Motion was approved by vote.

The July 8, 2018 minutes were then approved by vote and placed in the Session records book.

COMMUNICATIONS / CORRESPONDENCE:

Pastor Rodney noted that the Fall meeting of Cumberland Presbytery was Saturday, September 8, at the Mt. Pleasant CP Church at Caneyville, KY.

Steve Skipper was elected as the church elder delegate. Rodger Davis was elected to serve as the alternate elder delegate.

COMMITTEES

Building & Grounds Committee

Rodger brought to our attention some items that need our attention:

- (1) The flat screen tv in the fellowship hall is no longer working and may need to be replaced. Motion approved to replace this tv with a similar one.
- (2) The coke machine near the kitchen is cutting some of the cans as they are move through the machine. Motion approved to check out a possible fix or recycle it.
- (3) There are a number of trees that have dead limbs and could fall on the garage or a car. Will secure a couple of estimates for trimming.
- (4) The kitchen ice maker has stopped producing ice. A serviceman has suggested a replacement since repairs would

cost as much as a new model. Will look around for a replacement and bring some estimates back to the next meeting.

(5) The old Janitrol AC unit’s condenser fan motor has locked up. Since the Christian Education wing has two AC units (One is fairly new and works fine), we will reevaluate next spring.

Special thanks to Sean O’Meara for rewiring the toddler room circuit which had been tripping the breaker and had recently shorted out. Sean worked almost two days making the electrical repair.

The manse AC unit finally went completely out. The HVAC system is close to 20 years old and in need of replacement. Approved hiring Jarboe to replace the entire heating and AC units.

Finance Committee

A set of financial statements for July along with current banking statements were

shared by Ralph Hawkins, reviewed, and approved by vote.

Noted the carpet estimates and pledges to date. We have seven donors for the Pew Pad Challenge so far. We are encouraging more to support this challenge by purchasing a pad replacement which costs about \$200 to be "In Honor of" or "In Memory of" someone. Once we have the 30 pew pads funding, we will move to replace the carpet.

Christian Education Committee

Our first monthly midweek worship service was a success and was well attended by all ages. Steve and Jenna led the music with Steve bringing a moving message for us all.

A large group of youth stayed for the lock-in. Special thanks to Megan Kaelin who helped chaperone the group. Our recent Travelling Thursday trip was to KY. Down Under near Glasgow, KY. JCPS will begin Wednesday, August 15. Our next Travelling Thursday is being planned.

OTHER BUSINESS

Noted that our Fall Congregational meeting to elect Elders is August

19 for the Congregational meeting. Installation is set for August 26.

Reviewed our Elder Shepherding Ministry. Elders are encouraged to be in contact with our individual sheep on a regular basis.

The next Stated Meeting is scheduled for September 9, 2018 after church.

Motion made and approved to meet in an adjourned meeting Sunday morning, August 19.

Steve Young has spoken with Elder Sean O'Meara. Due to his work schedule, Sean has been unable to attend Sunday services or Session Meetings. As a result, Sean felt he should tender his resignation from the Session and asked the Session to receive that resignation.

Bro. Rodney visited with Janet Turner. Janet feels like she may finally be on track to regain her strength.

She is on a new health program with health professionals now making home visits as needed. Due to her health issues, Janet has been unable to be in church or attend Session meetings. She feels it best at this time to focus on her health over the next number of months. So she is asking the Session and the church to accept her resignation from the Session at this time.

Due to Janet's health issues and her need to be completely focused on her health and well being, the Session received Janet's resignation and recommends to the congregation that her resignation be accepted.

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NATIONAL GRANDPARENTS' DAY - SEPTEMBER 9

Congress passed the legislation proclaiming the first Sunday after Labor Day as **NATIONAL GRANDPARENTS'S DAY** and, on August 3, 1978, then-President Jimmy Carter signed the proclamation. The statute cites the day's purpose: "...to honor grandparents, to give grandparents an opportunity to show love for their children's children, and to help children become aware of strength, information, and guidance older people can offer".

National Grandparents' Day is a secular holiday celebrated in the United States since 1978 and officially recognized in a number of countries on various days of the year, either as one holiday or sometimes as a separate Grandmothers' Day and Grandfathers' Day

The **OFFICIAL FLOWER** of the U.S. National Grandparents Day is the forget-me-not which blooms in the spring. As a result, seasonal flowers are given in appreciation to grandparents on this day in 2004, the National Grandparents' Day Council of Chula Vista, California announced that "A Song for Grandma and Grandpa" by Johnny Prill would be the **OFFICIAL SONG** of the U.S. National Grandparents' Day holiday.
