SESSION NOTES

**REGULARLY STATED
SESSION MEETING –
SEPTEMBER 9, 2018**

The stated meeting of the Session was called to order on September 9, 2018 by Moderator, Rev. Rodney Harris, with a quorum declared at noon.

Elders present: Rodger Davis, Ralph Hawkins, Darlene Johnson, Laura Kaelin, Delbert Kyle, Steve Skipper, and Theresa Vaughn. Steve Young (Back Pain) was excused by vote. Laura Kaelin opened the meeting with prayer.

Pastor Rodney welcomed the new Session members (Darlene Johnson, Delbert Kyle, and Theresa Vaughn) and reviewed some basic meeting information and encouraged all Elders to be actively involved in discussions during our meetings.

The minutes of the Stated Meetings of August 12 and 26, 2018, along with the Adjourned meeting on Sunday, August 19 and Congregational meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 had been read on the Session’s Facebook page earlier. Stated clerk Laura Kaelin reviewed those minutes for the Session. Motion was made to approve these four sets of minutes as reviewed and read.

Motion was approved by vote to accept the four sets of minutes as printed and place them in the Session records book.

COMMUNICATIONS /
CORRESPONDANCE:

Steve Skipper and Bro. Rodney reported and shared some highlights from meeting of Cumberland Presbytery held at the Mt. Pleasant CP Church at Caneyville, KY on September 8.

Steve Skipper shared about his decision to answer a call to the gospel ministry. Steve feels the Lord is leading him to pursue Minister Ordination in the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. Presbytery requires a letter of recommendation from the local church Session to begin the process.

Motion made and unanimously approved sending a letter of recommendation to Cumberland Presbytery on behalf of Elder Steve Skipper to enter the Program of Alternate Studies (PAS) toward ordination to the gospel ministry.

A time for the annual election of a Session Clerk was held. Laura Kaelin was nominated and elected by vote.

COMMITTEES

Building & Grounds Committee

Rodger brought to our attention some items that need our attention:

(1) The flat screen TV in the fellowship hall is no longer working. Will continue to look for a larger TV replacement.

(2) The coke machine near the kitchen has been repaired by a member of the LifeChurch group. Bro. Rodney will personally express our appreciation to the afternoon church. (Delbert and Sammy Kyle have volunteered to oversee the machine’s care, cleaning, and filling.)

(3) There are a number of trees that have dead limbs that could fall on the manse, garage, or a car. Waiting on two estimates for the trimming and hauling away of the cuttings.

(4) The kitchen ice maker has stopped producing ice. We are looking at new ice makers as well as a possible repair. Reviewed prices on a number of ice makers. Elders will purchase bags of ice and place in the large chest freezer until we have a working ice maker.

Finance Committee

A set of financial statements for August along with current banking statements were shared by Ralph Hawkins, reviewed, and approved by vote.

Ralph shared the updated Pew Pad Challenge donations (18 pews to date) as printed out by Stacy Kyle. We are encouraging more to support this challenge by purchasing a pad replacement which costs about \$200, which could be made "In Honor of" or "In Memory of" a family member or church member. Once we have the 30 pew pads funded, we will move to replace the carpet as well.

Christian Education Committee

Our next monthly Wednesday night worship service is set for October 3rd at 7 PM. for all ages. A secondary date will be October 10

if needed. A large group was in attendance for our first service and lock-in. Our next Traveling Thursday is being planned.

The annual Haunted House event is in the planning stage and may be held on October 17 or 24 prior due to Halloween falling on the last Wednesday in October. A better attendance is expected at an earlier date.

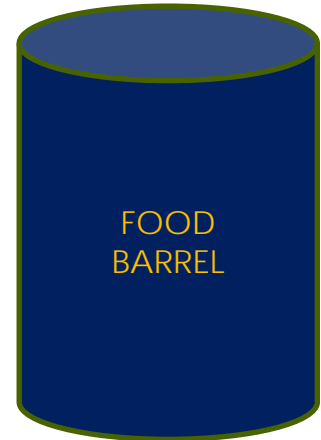
OTHER BUSINESS

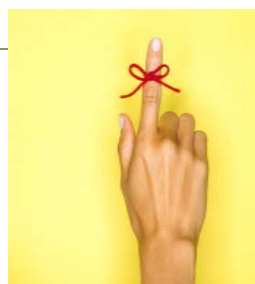
